Our Goals for Students Achievement

District Goals. The District goals are:

- a) Vary learning experience to increase success in career paths.
- b) Differentiate resources for the areas/schools based on needs.
- c) Develop stakeholder involvement to promote students success.
- Recruit, hire, support, and retain employees for the highest level of excellence.

School Goals. The School goals are:

Goal #1: Increase the percentage of students meeting and exceeding standards in English Language Arts. Currently 15% of the students are proficient or advanced on the English Language Arts portion of the RI (Reading Inventory). Our goal will be to increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or higher by 10% as measured from basic to proficient on the RI (Reading Inventory).

Goal #2 Increase the number of students meeting and exceeding standards in math. In Spring of 2017, 56.1% of the students were scoring proficient on the MI (Math Inventory). Our goal will be to increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or higher by 15% from the August 2017 Math Inventory to the May 2018 Math Inventory.

Teachers, Parents, and Students - Together for Success

Teachers. The 2nd Grade Title I Teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- Our grade level will provide instruction using books at each student's level to meet their individual needs.
- Our grade level will provide instruction within each genre and time for students to practice writing daily.
- Our grade level will provide strategies for adding and subtracting to use when solving real world problems.
- A grade level blog will be created for families to access learning activities and ways to help in the classroom.
 Our school newsletter and website will also include school related activities.

At Home. Fair Oaks Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list.

- Listen to my child read from books at his/her level each day for 25 minutes.
- Use real life situations to discuss when we should add and when we should subtract numbers with my child.
- Challenge my child to write daily.
- Review newsletter and school work by checking his/her backpack and folder every day and provide time and support for homework daily.

Students. Fair Oaks Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars.

- Read books at my level for 25 minutes each day.
- Practice adding and subtracting in real life situations using visuals and explanations.
- Apply my understanding of writing with each genre and create pieces that meet grade level standards.
- Set reading, writing and math goals and monitor my progress in my Leadership notebook.
